RANGE SAFETY TEST

The below described procedure is not necessarily the best way to handle and use a firearm on the indoor range. It is, however, the mandated procedure for <u>this test</u>.

To ensure that everyone who uses the Club's ranges does so in a safe manner, all new Members of the Club will demonstrate their ability to safely handle a firearm and their knowledge of the Range Rules to an authorized CPFGC Range Officer.

This is a "pass/fail" event. Any safety violation will result in failure. Failure will require the applicant to reschedule time with the same Range Officer, at the RO's convenience. Applicants will not be granted range access until they have successfully completed the test.

4.	Fire three (3) rounds at a standard NRA 50-foot target placed 21 feet downrange. All shots must impact the target paper.	
5.	Unload the firearm and place it safely on the shooting bench for the	e Range Officer's inspection.
6.	Safely move the firearm back to the rear table and case it.
