RANGE SAFETY TEST

The below described procedure is not necessarily the best way to handle and use a firearm on the indoor range. It is, however, the mandated procedure for this test.

To ensure that everyone who uses the Club's ranges does so in a safe manner, all new Members of the Club will demonstrate their ability to safely handle a firearm and their knowledge of the Range Rules to an authorized CPFGC Range Officer.

This is a "pass/fail" event. Any safety violation will result in failure. Failure will require the applicant to reschedule time with the same Range Officer, at the RO's convenience. Applicants will not be granted range access until they have successfully completed the test.

KNOWLEDGE OF RANGE RULES

The Club's current Range Rules and Bylaws may be found on the Club's website.

Applicant must respond to the following by initialing each of the three statements.

- ___ a) I have reviewed and understand the current Rules and Bylaws.
- ___ b) I have had an opportunity to ask questions concerning the behaviors and knowledge to be tested.
- ___ c) I understand that a violation of any of the Bylaws or Rules may result in disciplinary action relative to Article VIII of CPFGC's Bylaws.

DEMONSTRATION OF SAFE FIREARM HANDLING

For the purposes of this test, applicant must use their own firearm, chambered in either **.22 LR**, **.380 ACP**, **9x19mm**, or **38 Special**, and must supply their own ammunition. When making the appointment, applicant must inform the Examiner of the caliber to be used. **The firearm must be unloaded and safely cased prior to entering the range.**

**ON THE INDOOR RANGE, THE ONLY SAFE DIRECTION IS DOWN.
ONCE YOU ARE ON THE FIRING LINE, DOWNRANGE IS ALSO SAFE.**

Applicant may fire from the shooting bench using any safe position or stance and may use a rest if desired.

Applicant, when directed, will:

1. Place the cased firearm on the rear table, remove the firearm from the case, and make it safe.
2. Safely move the firearm, unloaded magazine (if required for your firearm), and ammunition to the designated shooting lane and place them safely on the shooting bench.
3. Step back and allow the Range Officer to load at least five (5) rounds into the magazine of a semi-automatic or into the cylinder of a revolver.
4. Fire three (3) rounds at a standard NRA 50-foot target placed 21 feet downrange. All shots must impact the target paper.
5. Unload the firearm and place it safely on the shooting bench for the Range Officer's inspection.
6. Safely move the firearm back to the rear table and case it.
