

Firearms up to \$600: \$10 Firearms \$601 & up: \$15 Ammo & Accessories: 5% All Transfers: \$10

Notice: Members who purchase thru the Club will incur an additional \$20.00 charge if products are shipped to the Club via FEDEX. Ask for UPS or USPS.

Members who order firearms themselves, to be delivered to the Club, must require the sender to include an invoice or other form describing the firearms' make, model, caliber, serial number, and name of sender. A form for this purpose is available at the club. If this is not included, the firearm will be returned to the sender, and a \$10.00 charge will be assessed to the Member.

Board of Directors

If you'd like to schedule an event or activity, raise an issue, or discuss an issue with the BOD at one of their monthly meetings, please let the Secretary or the President know as soon as you can — certainly no later than 24 hours ahead of time — so that your item can be added to the agenda. Political Concerns by John Carr

One of the greatest threats to America's gun owners is the United Nations. Actually the UN is one of the greatest threats to freedom itself.

Elements of this politically corrupt organization have hatched a nefarious piece of work entitled "Program of Action to Prevent, Combat and Eradicate the Illicit Trade in Small Arms and Light Weapons in all its Aspects", a tyrant's dream of a plan to disarm the people of the world, leaving them completely at the mercy of the government. This plan is aimed directly at the United States, one of the few countries where civilian ownership of firearms is still legally possible.

The Bush administration, under the leadership of UN Ambassador John Bolton, rejected the small arms treaty. Bolton plainly told the world that the United States will not accept a gun control document that violates our Constitutional right to bear arms. Harold Koh, current Legal Counsel for the US State Department under the Obama Administration, commented that Bolton was being "needlessly provocative." In a paper entitled "A world drowning in guns", Koh maintains that a civil society cannot exist with broad gun ownership: "Guns kill civil society". The Obama regime, thru Secretary of State Hillary Rodham Clinton, has announced that it will indeed support this anti-American, anti-freedom resolution.

The best line of defense against this onerous treaty is the United States Senate. The Senate must ratify any treaty before it becomes binding. Should this treaty be approved in the Senate, it will trump even the US Constitution, rendering the Second Amendment null and void.

It is unlikely that this will come to the Senate for ratification anytime soon, but it is never too early to begin preparations to fight this.

An even more pressing danger to American freedom is the "Inter-American Convention Against the Illicit Manufacturing of and Trafficking in Firearms, Ammunition, Explosives, and Other Related Materials" or CIFTA Treaty. This also would need to



be ratified by the US Senate, and if that happens, we can look forward to:

- Major required gun controls, most of which will affect average citizens (as well as the targeted criminal syndicates, dictators and other bad actors).
- Controls that go way past anything ever attempted by gun-control groups in the United States.
- ~ None of the proposed gun controls are likely to pass by themselves through Congress. If the treaty is enacted they don't have to they become law when the treaty is ratified.
- Virtually no protections for RKBA can be found, and the wordings are loose enough to allow all sorts of attacks on gun rights American enjoy today.
- The US government under this treaty gains power to manage firearms almost any way it would like to, without any checks and balances.
- Once signed, many of the restrictions and government intrusions become mandatory, and the full Congress, already cut out of ratification (only the Senate approves treaties), would be cut out of the implementation process entirely.
- Top to bottom registration of all firearms, ammunition, ammunition components and other related materials is required if they are "in transit" and records must be kept indefinitely. This vague language, and the requirement to comply are a gun-banner's dream and a rights advocate's nightmare.
- ~ "Transit licenses or authorizations" for transfers of firearms are required for imported firearms, and loose language

could include the same for all domestic firearms.

- Lengthy recordkeeping is required that directly conflicts with US law, and would be left up to bureaucrats and arbitrary controls and implementation.
- Home reloading of ammunition would become illegal and subject to severe sanctions, without government licensing that is undefined and could include almost any conditions, taxes and limitations, including scrupulous inventorying, recordkeeping and unscheduled audit searches of people who reload.
- Similar licensing and controls will be required on anything made "that can be attached to a firearm," known as "other related materials." This includes components, parts, replacement parts and such items as wood or composite stocks, slings, bayonets, bayonet lugs, sights, scopes, rails, lasers, grips, flash hiders, suppressors, muzzle brakes, and other paraphernalia. Attaching any such parts without a government license would be "illicit manufacture," a criminal act with undefined penalties.
- Record sharing requirements ensure that any gun-owner data that must be destroyed under current US law can be easily stored abroad, and can be retrieved at will as required under various international "cooperation" clauses.

CIFTA = Tyranny

These things will affect EVERY gun enthusiast. They need to be fought... HARD.

On a completely different front, congratulations to Massachusetts voters on their choice for US Senator. As far as freedoms go, Scott Brown is a far better choice than his opponent would have been.
