The following notice is posted on the ATI Website at http://www.americantactical.us/

To all retail customers:

On January 2010 American Tactical Imports Inc received official notification from the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives that the original barrel shroud (aka: fake suppressor) supplied with your GSG 5 SD model must be replaced. *It has been determined that this shroud is regulated under the National Firearms Act.* American Tactical will provide a replacement shroud at no charge for each GSG 5 SD model sold or currently in inventory.

Consumers in possession of a GSG 5 SD model with the original shroud in place on the firearm are now in violation of the NFA. To avoid continued violation of the NFA, ATI asks that all persons in possession obtain a replacement shroud as soon as possible. We anticipate arrival of the new shrouds to begin by the middle of February 2010.

IMPORTANT: The original SD model shroud must be returned accompanied by the firearm serial number before a replacement shroud is issued. The diameter of the SD shroud is 1-9/16". Do not return the smaller carbine shroud.

WHAT TO DO:

If possible return your old shroud to the dealer where purchased and show him this notice. The shroud will be returned to ATI along with a list of serial numbers from the guns that the shrouds were removed. ATI will send replacements to the dealer for pick up at your convenience; ATI will be sending replacements as fast as logistics allow. If your dealer is out of business or difficult to reach, or you purchased your gun used, from a consumer, return the shroud directly by US mail or UPS to:

PLEASE TRY NOT TO CALL US. We will provide comprehensive information on our web site <u>www.americantactical.us</u>, and <u>www.arl5.com</u> or by e-mail to <u>atiexchange@americantactical.us</u>

Remember, include the firearm serial number with each shroud or a replacement will not be issued.

This action IS NOT being instituted through any fault and is strictly due to NFA compliance. American Tactical will assume the responsibility to satisfy the requirements in an effort to minimize the impact on our customers and protect your investment.

We at American Tactical Imports Inc. sincerely apologize for any inconvenience caused by this unfortunate situation.

Political Concerns

NH House Bill 1635 - This legislation would outlaw the possession of firearms in state or town buildings, including state-operated rest areas, the university system/community college system of NH, the State House complex, etc. Enactment of HB 1635 would create victim zones by disarming potential crime victims. Moreover, because posting of prohibited premises would be optional, a person could enter into a prohibited property or place unknowingly and become a felon for life. The House Criminal Justice and Public Safety Committee will consider this bill. (Source: NRA/ILA)

Ed Note: The House voted this bill as Inexpedient to Legislate on 17 March by a vote of 256-33.

The US House of Representatives passed HR 3326, the Department of Defense Appropriations Act of 2010. There is a rider attached to this bill to protect M-1 carbines, M-1 Garands, M-

14s, .22 caliber rifles, and others from being destroyed. The language also included a prohibition on the destruction of small arms ammunition and components, passed in response to the short-lived concern over destruction of spent brass casings. A small win for the shooting community but an important one in my opinion. (Source: NRA)

The US Supreme Court agreed to hear the landmark Second Amendment case of McDonald v. Chicago. The case will address the application of the Second Amendment to the states through either the Due Process clause or the Privileges or Immunities clause of the Fourteenth Amendment. This case would guarantee the application of the Second Amendment through out the fifty states and US possessions as adjudicated by the Supreme Court.

Ed Note: The US Supreme Court heard arguments on this bill on 2 March 2010.

NH honors resident licenses from AK, AL, AZ, CO, FL, GA, ID, IN, KY, LA, MI, MO, MS, NC, ND, OK, PA, TN, UT, and WY, but no non-resident licenses.

This map shows the same data if you have a Massachusetts Class A License.



Massachusetts doesn't honor any other states' licenses at all.

Cowboy Action Shooting Returns to CPF&G

Howdy!

Cowboy Action Shooting (CAS) is all about dressin' up like folks did in the Old West and shootin' guns that were commonly used back then.

Targets are steel plates, and they're big and close, so expert marksmanship ain't necessary. We set targets so that every shooter, regardless of experience, can hit every single target. It's how quickly you hit 'em that makes the difference.

Our matches are pretty easy going. We don't try to compete so much as have a good time. Being safe and havin' fun are the two rules that we strictly enforce.

As far as dressin' up, we're not all that formal about it, but dressin' up is half the fun! All you really need is pair of jeans, a long-sleeved shirt, and boots. The only things that we really insist on are: no baseball-style caps, sneakers, short sleeve shirts, nylon or web gear, or Velcro. They just didn't have any of that stuff in the 1800s.

We use firearms that were available prior to 1899 - originals or replicas. You'll need two single-action six-guns, a lever-action rifle (in pistol caliber only), and a side-by-side double-barrel or exposed hammer pump shotgun. by Piney Woods

Don't worry if you don't have the right guns, most of the regular shooters are willin' to lend firearms and ammo to new shooters, just so they can get the hang of it. That's how I got started in this. I didn't have any of the right gear, but one of the old cowhands loaned me a complete setup and I was hooked! A lot of us bring extra guns and ammo in case someone shows up and wants to try this game on for size.

To shoot a match at CPF&G, you'll need about 60 rounds each of pistol and rifle ammo, and 25 shotshells. Both rifle and pistol ammo must be pistol caliber (.45 Colt, .44 Special, 38 Special, etc.) lead bullets only - no jacketed or rifle caliber ammo allowed - and all ammo should be mild field or target loads. All shotshells must be size 7 ½ or smaller lead shot.

Our matches are divided into six "Stages". Each stage is a different course of fire, and has a "Scenario" to go with it. The scenario is a short storyline that explains why each stage is set up the way it is. A typical scenario might start out with "You're in the saloon when in walk two hombres with fire in their eyes..."

We shoot three stages, break for lunch,

then shoot three more. The stages and scenarios are different for each match and they're posted in advance on the Club website. Results are posted in the same place.

This year we'll host six CAS matches at CPF&G, with our first one on April 18th. Our remaining matches for 2010 will be held in May (our famous "All Ladies Shoot Free" Mother's Day Match), June, August, September, and October. Registration is from 10:30 to 11:45, followed by a mandatory safety meeting. The shootin' starts at High Noon, and we're usually done by 4:30. The cost is \$5.00 for CPF&G Club Members, \$10.00 for non-members, and Juniors (under 16) always shoot for free.

Our matches at CPF&G are a great way to experience what CAS is all about. Once you've tried it you'll be hooked! The folks are friendly and, no matter what your skill level, you're welcome to come join us! Come on down and be an Old West cowboy or cowgirl for the day. You'll have a ball.

Members who order guns themselves, to be delivered to the Club, must require the sender to include an invoice or other form describing the firearms' make, model, caliber, serial number, and name of sender. A form for this purpose is available at the club. If this data is not included, the firearm will be returned to the sender, and a \$10.00 charge will be assessed to the Member.

Earl Tibbetts will be at the clubhouse Saturdays, from 11:00 to 13:00, for any firearms orders or transactions.

Notice: There will be an additional \$20.00 charge for items shipped to the Club via FED/EX. Choose UPS or the US Postal Service instead.
