Hail & Farewell

Robert A. Beal, of Seabrook, died at Exeter Hospital, Monday, 17 Jan 2011.

Born 21 Dec 1935, in Newburyport, MA, the son of the late Onsville A. Beal and the late Alice (Greenman) Brown.

Mr. Beal attended Seabrook schools and graduated Amesbury High School, Class of 1954. He served his country honorably in the US Air Force (1954-58), and achieved the rank of Sergeant.

He is survived by four children, Robert A. Beal Jr. and his wife, Marjorie, of Sandown, Barbara J. Beal of Palm Bay, FL, Bambi Beal-Carson and her husband, David Carson, of Seabrook, and Coralee U. Beal and her spouse, Deborah Munson, of Chester; his sister, Dorothy E. Chase of Seabrook; his brother, Clyde O. Brown Jr. and his wife, Darcy, of Seabrook; and several nephews and nieces.

Bob attended the Lynn Independent Industrial Shoemaking School, New England Bartenders School, and completed courses in heating, refrigeration, and history. He was a pattern maker and assistant foreman at Newbury Shoe Co. of Newburyport, Merker Shoe Counter Co. of Haverhill, and Engel Lewis Shoe Counter Co. of Merrimac. Bob also worked as a bartender at the Royal Motor Lodge, was the lounge manager at the Port Malabar Country Club in Florida, and was employed as general manager of the Hampshire Motor Inn of Seabrook.

Bob was a member and chairman of the Seabrook Zoning Board of Adjustment (1976-79), and was trustee of the Dr. Dearborn Scholarship Fund (1975-79). He was a member of Trinity United Church and the Four Corners Church in Seabrook, The Gideons, American Legion Post 70 of Seabrook, St. James Lodge #102 of Hampton, and the Hampton Falls Grange.

Mr. Beal was known locally for singing at various churches and other events. He was also a ham radio operator and enjoyed genealogy and gardening.

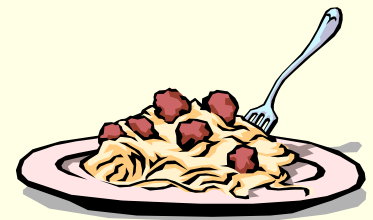

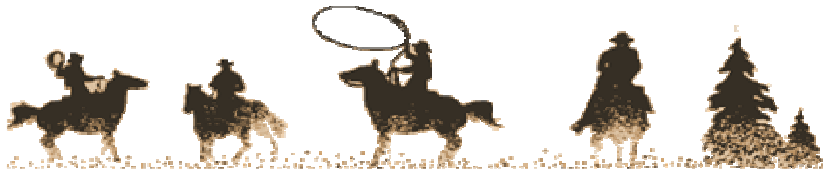

Cowboy Action Shooting Returns to CPF&G

Howdy!

Cowboy Action Shooting (CAS) is all about dressin' up like folks did in the Old West and shootin' guns that were commonly used back then.

Targets are steel plates, and they're big and close, so expert marksmanship ain't necessary. We set targets so that every shooter, regardless of experience, can hit every single target. It's how quickly you hit 'em that makes the difference.

Our matches are pretty easy going. We don't try to compete so much as have a good time. Being safe and havin' fun are the two rules that we strictly enforce.

As far as dressin' up, we're not all that formal about it, but dressin' up is half the fun! All you really need is pair of jeans, a long-sleeved shirt, and boots. The only things that we really insist on are: no baseball-style caps, sneakers, short sleeve shirts, nylon or web gear, or Velcro. They just didn't have any of that stuff in the 1800s.

We use firearms that were available prior to 1899 - originals or replicas. You'll need two single-action six-guns, a lever-action rifle (in pistol caliber only), and a side-by-side double-barrel or exposed hammer pump shotgun.

Don't worry if you don't have the right guns, most of the regular shooters are willin' to lend firearms and ammo to new shooters, just so they can get the hang of it. That's how I got started in this. I didn't have any of the right gear, but one of the old cowhands loaned me a complete setup and I was hooked! A lot of us bring extra guns and ammo in case someone shows up and wants to try this game on for size.

To shoot a match at CPF&G, you'll need about 60 rounds each of pistol and rifle ammo, and 25 shotshells. Both rifle and pistol ammo must be pistol caliber (.45 Colt, .44 Special, 38 Special, etc.) lead bullets only - no jacketed or rifle caliber ammo allowed - and all ammo should be mild field or target loads. All shotshells must be size 7 1/2 or smaller lead shot.

Our matches are divided into six "Stages". Each stage is a different course of fire, and has a "Scenario" to go with it. The scenario is a short storyline that explains why each stage is set up the way it is. A typical scenario might start out with "You're in the saloon when in walk two hombres with fire in their eyes..."

We shoot three stages, break for lunch, then shoot three more. The stages and

scenarios are different for each match and they're posted in advance on the Club website. Results are posted in the same place.

This year we'll host six CAS matches at CPF&G, with our first one on April 17th. Our remaining matches for 2011 will be held in May (*our famous "All Ladies Shoot Free" Mother's Day Match*), June, August, September, and October. Registration is from 10:30 to 11:45, followed by a mandatory safety meeting. The shootin' starts at High Noon, and we're usually done by 4:30 or so. The cost is \$5.00 for CPF&G Club Members, \$10.00 for non-members, and Juniors (under 16) always shoot for free.

Our matches at CPF&G are a great way to experience what CAS is all about. Once you've tried it you'll be hooked! The folks are friendly and, no matter what your skill level, you're welcome to come join us! Gun Rights Organizations

"A well regulated militia, being necessary to the security of a free state, the right of the people to keep and bear arms, shall not be infringed."

- United States Constitution - Amendment II - ratified 1791
