#### **Right to Carry?**

The maps below show where you can legally carry a concealed firearm if you have a License to Carry (blue states), where you can legally carry only if you have a <u>resident LTC</u> (tan states), and where you can't at all (red states).

This map shows where you can legally carry if you have a **New Hampshire** License.

This map shows the same data if you have a Maine LTC.



NH honors <u>resident</u> licenses from AL, AZ, AR, CO, FL, GA, ID, IN, IA, KY, LA, MI, MO, MS, NC, ND, OK, PA, TN, UT, WV, and WY, but no non-resident licenses.

This map shows the same data if you have a **Massachusetts** <u>Class A</u> LTC.



Massachusetts doesn't honor any other states' licenses at all. (Why are we not surprised?)



ME honors <u>resident</u> licenses from AR, DE, LA, MI, ND, PA, SD, and WY, but no non-resident licenses.

And here's the map of states where you can legally carry a concealed firearm if you have a Utah License to Carry.



Utah honors all other states Permit/Licenses. and honors nonresident Permits/Licenses from the states they honor.

Obviously, if you travel around the US, and you carry a concealed handgun, it pays to have a Utah License, in addition to whatever resident License you may have. We will be holding a Utah Non-Resident License Training Class at CPF&G Club on Saturday, 21 March. Successfully completing a Utah approved class is a prerequisite for obtaining a Utah License.

The course will be open to the public, but will be limited to 15 students, and CPF&G Club Members will have priority. All students must register in advance. No walk-ins will be permitted. Richard J. "Dick" Bowen, age 83, longtime resident of Plaistow NH, passed away peacefully on Saturday, June 21, 2014 in Haverhill, MA. He was born on February 19, 1931 in Brockton, MA the son of the late Edmund and Elsie (Moberg) Bowen. He was raised and educated in Palmer, MA and graduated from Palmer High School Class of 1949. He attended Springfield College.

Dick enlisted in the US Army Air Corps right out of high school. He served during the Korean War.

He worked for many years at MIT-Draper Labs in Cambridge, MA and was involved with design projects for the Apollo Space Program. He also worked for Raytheon Corp. on their missile systems. He had worked for Kollsman Instruments in Merrimack, NH on radar altimeters and thermal night sights projects for the M1 Tank. He retired in the early 1990s.

Dick was an avid lifelong shooting enthusiast and gun collector. He loved history and was a founding member of the Plaistow Historical Society. He helped to plan the first Plaistow Old Home Days event. He was an active member of Country Pond Fish & Game Club in Newton for many years. An avid outdoorsman, he loved camping and canoeing. He enjoyed woodworking and made many projects that were given as gifts to family and friends. As a younger man, he enjoyed car rallies and races for many years.

He is survived by his daughter, Robin J. Bracero and husband, Jorge of Manchester, NH. His sons, Alan D. Bowen of Plaistow, NH, John P. "Jack" Bowen and wife, Denise of Kingston, NH and Christopher E. Bowen and wife, Lea of Plaistow, NH. 11 grandchildren and 12 greatgrandchildren also survive him.

#### **CPF&G Club Centerfire Pistol League**

This year, the Country Pond Fish & Game Club Centerfire Pistol League, open to all members, starts on February 11. I thought I would start this article with a little bit of history, because I think it provides some basis for how the league runs and explains the differences between it and the .22 Rimfire League. When I joined CPF&G Club about seven years ago, at the behest of my good friend Dick Chavers, he "dragged" me back into shooting sports that I had much enjoyed as a youth. He taught me the basics of pistol shooting and reloading, and I often admired how he would just stop some newcomer to the range and ask – "Do you mind if I give you a few pointers?" Finally, he said to me one day that he was running a centerfire league and invited me to join in. He told me that the way it was conducted was less formal and not as structured as the rimfire league. He also wanted it to be fun and also instructional. Weekly scores were tracked with pencil and paper, but not consistently, and were not disseminated. Of course, this is not to disparage or criticize the Rimfire League at all. I activity participate in that league and really enjoy it. As I became more involved and began to help run the Centerfire League, I have tried to carry the principles that Dick espoused forward.

#### So here are the basics.

The league is at the same time as the rimfire league – Wednesdays from 1700 to 2000. It convenes for seven nights with the last session this year on March 25. I have sometimes been asked why it is not longer. The answer to that is that prior years experience has shown that, with the onset of spring, attendance has suffered with the advent of spring chores and activities - fishing and spring trap come to mind!

Three targets are shot each night; slow, timed, and rapid. The times - 10 minutes for slow fire, 20 sec for each five shot string for timed fire - are the same as for the Rimfire League. by Jim Graczyk

However, we have always done what we call a "modified" rapid fire – using 20 seconds for that as well as for timed fire.

As far as firearms are concerned, we have little restrictions. If you want to use a different one each week that is fine. Changing firearms during a session however it not allowed. Finally, Club rules regarding caliber sizes that are allowed obviously apply.

It is a participant's choice as to whether they shoot one or two handed, and this is not tracked.

The last night is a "fun night" and no scores are kept. We traditionally do different activities like shooting at backward targets, small stickers on regular targets, opposite hand shooting, and things like that. Dick would sometimes bring some of his firearms that were a bit unusual single actions and the like. Any ideas that participants have would be welcome. We also do pizza on the last night and have some awards. Last year we awarded .22 ammo for high average in the various categories - Slow Fire, Timed Fire, Rapid Fire, and Overall Average. We did this for optical sights and iron sights as separate categories. Drawing from my trap fun shoot experience, we also did a "Lewis" award. You have to ask Clyde Henshaw where that name comes from! Anyway, basically you rank order everyone's scores and divide the list into an upper and lower class. The top

of the lower class gets an award. It is a way of trying to spread the awards around.

As far as tracking scores, last year we did use a spreadsheet to track scores and email was sent. This was the first time we did this and people seemed to like it. Piney has developed a new spreadsheet for the Rimfire League and we will be using a modified version of that to keep track of weekly results. With that spreadsheet, results will be posted on our website instead of being sent by email. Finally, unlike the Rimfire League we will not have teams or calculated handicaps.

We will be having a meeting on February 4 at 7:00pm, prior to the start of the league. At that time, we can collectively decide if we want to change how anything works. That is the day of the last Rimfire League match. Anybody missing the meeting because they are on the range shooting can just be brought on board afterwards. I would mention that my co-worker, Chris Gordon, is becoming bionic with two new knees. He is planning on helping out as best he can but I am looking for someone to help out running things once and awhile.

Finally, if you know that you will participate, please email me at jamesfgraczyk@gmail.com and let me know. I want to do as much preparation of the record keeping as possible ahead of time.
