Chasing Rabbits on a Budget

Rabbit hunting over dogs is a lot of fun—and highly successful. However, not everyone has the time, money, or energy to train a pack of hounds. This doesn't mean that you have to give up on rabbit hunting! Rabbit hunters can still be quite successful by working in pairs or small groups to push rabbits out of the woods. One hunter can be the "dog" and walk slowly through a patch of dense brush, while their hunting partner walks alongside them on a trail or through a clearing (the best areas for this are old clear-cuts with logging roads still visible). It is important to stay parallel, so that the shooter's firing line is always in front of their partner. As the "dog" moves forward, the rabbits will be forced to run, oftentimes breaking for another patch of cover on the other side of the clearing. Be ready! The rabbits will be at top speed crossing the opening, but a keen hunter can get off a quick shot or two—with a lot of lead—and put a rabbit in their vest. If you want to stay hunting partners after the trip, it is recommended that you switch between being the "dog" and being the shooter after every push. This method may not be as successful as hunting with real dogs, but it will get you out in the field on a budget.

Safety First! New Range Rules

A recent change on the Outdoor Range has been enacted;

All shooting shall be done from the approved firing line, except during Club sanctioned events. This means that all shooting is done from the concrete pad. You are no longer allowed to advance the firing line.

There have been a few incidents on the ranges that require reminders;

- Except during Club-sanctioned events, all targets must be placed according to the diagram in the Range Rules, Section G.
- Steel targets may not be rigidly mounted; they must be free to swing or move on impact. Hanging plates must be supported in such a way that the target face is initially angled downward by no less than 10°.
- The practice of shooting when drawing from a holster is prohibited, except under the direct supervision of the Chief Range Officer or certified Club instructor, or during a Club sanctioned event.
- Firearms will not be taken down range unless carried in a holster designed for that firearm.
- Absolutely no alcoholic beverages are allowed on any Club range at any time. This includes empty beer cans as targets.

Example of <u>Safe Range Use</u> in accordance with the new and existing range rules

- Shooter is behind the provided bench, shooting from the designated firing line (the concrete pad)
- Shooter is firing at a properly mounted, free swinging metal target
- Targets are mounted so misses and pass-throughs only impact the berm
- As always, the shooter is wearing proper hearing and eye protection
