Modular Firearms and Ancient Traditions

Customizing weapons to suit personal tastes or particular tasks has been going on for thousands of years. Whether it be a ruby inlay on the hilt of a Dark Age sword or a Wilson Combat grip module on a Sig P320, it seems to be in our nature to personalize our weapons much more than any other tools we use. While I could write pages on the intricacies of ancient and historic weaponry, you are undoubtedly here for gun content. Luckily the gun industry has seen massive improvements to modularity and a flood of aftermarket attachments in recent years.

Perhaps the clearest example of this push for personalization is found with Sig Sauer's lines of modern handguns, especially the P320 and P365. The serialized fire control group on both models can be removed in a matter of seconds without any special



tools. This allows owners to swap everything from frames to barrels, slides, and even caliber with next to no effort. Many other companies allow for similar modularity in their platforms, with the recent introduction of Glock's model 47 which can accept parts, accessories, and magazines from multiple other popular Glock handguns, notably the 17, 19, 19x, and 45. This modularity and, with Glock, parts compatibility, encourages owners to make changes to their firearms to better suit their needs.



Other options like rails have been around for a long time now. These allow owners to attach any number of accessories to their firearms from lights and lasers to grips and bipods. All of these accessories can, again, be used to personalize your shooting experience and adjust the capabilities of a firearm to your individual needs. Rails have also been used for decades to allow optics to be mounted to rifles, but the addition of optics cuts on handguns is relatively new to the gun world. It is a trend that has taken off like a wild fire.

Nearly every model of modern handgun has options for mounting an optic, from full-size duty pistols to sub-compact pocket pistols. Even models which do not feature a factory optics-cut can be fitted with a new sight at home with a variety of aftermarket adapters. The demand for optics has flooded the market with options and even driven many firearms manufacturers to collaborate with optics manufacturers, in the case of the Glock A-Cut models that will fit the new Aimpoint COA out of the box (or even ship with the COA)!

Customization is nothing new when it comes to our personal weapons. However, major firearms manufacturers have certainly yielded to aftermarket demand with the release of modular designs and, in many cases, the creation of their own lines of aftermarket parts. In keeping with the ancient human tradition of customizing and personalizing our weapons, you should definitely look into aftermarket options for your modern firearms!
