# Pistol Cal Carbines Allowed for Deer in NH

Updated rules have been announced for New Hampshire's 2025 hunting season, including changes to youth hunting seasons, the allowance of crossbows in several Wildlife Management Units (WMUs), and the allowance of large caliber air-rifles for big-game hunting. Perhaps the most exciting update to New Hampshire's hunting regulations, taking effect September 1st, is the approval of all pistol caliber carbines chambered in .357 mag-



num or greater for use during deer season throughout the state! A few years ago, NH Fish and Game allowed lever-action carbines to be used in WMUs that previously only allowed shotguns during the general firearm season. As of 2025, all carbines, regardless of action, are on the table. Admittedly, most pistol caliber carbines that meet the power requirements for taking big game are lever actions. However, there are many bolt-action and even semi-automatic carbines that can now be used, including the handy Ruger Model 44. This classic, lightweight rifle is chambered in .44 magnum. With a significantly longer barrel than the typical revolver firing the same cartridge, the Model 44 is capable of delivering as much energy as a .50 caliber muzzleloader (well known to be effective on whitetails) with significantly faster follow up shots. A brief history of the Model 44 reveals some troubling political opinions expressed by Ruger at the time of its invention. The low capacity tubular magazine featured on this carbine should speak for itself in that matter. Despite this, Ruger's carbine became a



popular brush gun for hunters and woodsmen. The Model 44 provides an excellent platform when a couple very effective shots at close range outweigh long range accuracy or high capacity; in other words, deer hunting in thick cover. While it is difficult to argue against the effectiveness of a 12 gauge slug within 100 yards, the ability to use carbines across the entire state provides a chance to dust off some classic hunting rifles.

Prior to his passing, long time member Bob Hodgdon asked Jim Graczyk to take all of his firearms, reloading equipment, ammunition (reloads and factory), and miscellaneous shooting gear to sell at auction. Jim is currently preparing a spreadsheet of the items to be auctioned, including a variety of firearms, ammunition, and reloading supplies, most notably a Lee Loadmaster 1000 progressive reloader with set ups for seven different calibers.
