

- 1) Winchester Model 36, 9mm Rimfire Shotgun. Bolt action. Made between 1920-1927. This is a somewhat rare collector. Gumwood stock. Manual cocking Knob. Fully Functional. You can buy ammo from Fiocchi via Midway. \$400
- 2) JC Higgins Model 5831, Sears model, 12 gauge, bolt action. 4 shot tube feed. Good condition. \$75
- 3) Marlin Golden 39A Mountie lever action, 22 LR, with Tasco 4 x 15 Scope. Leather Carry Strap. Excellent Condition. \$450
- 4) Mossberg Model 46B, 22 LR, Tube fed, Bolt action. \$100
- 5) J. Stevens Model 235, 12 Gauge, side by side with external "Rabbit ear" hammers. Circa 1909-1915. Tarnished. Could use a good recondition. Fully functional. \$200
- 6) Iver-Johnson Champion, 16 Gauge shotgun. Walnut stock, heat treated receiver. Fully Functional. \$100
- 7) Winchester Model 55, 22 LR, Dubbed as a single shot, Auto. \$100
- 8) Stevens Model 5100, 12 Gauge, side by side, internal hammers, Heat treated receiver with engraved Hunting dog scene, fully functional, Nice Walnut stock and fore-end. Could use a good cleaning/rehab. \$150
- 9) EIG-EIBAR Spanish Percussion pistol, 12mm, 9.5" length. \$100
- 10) EIG "Tower" flintlock, Japan made, .69 caliber. \$125
- 11) Mark 1 – USN Dummy training Rifle by Parris-Dunn. Not a real firearm. Built in WW2 for training only so the real rifles could be on the battlefield.
